Dear Prosecutor Masiello,

On behalf of Alley Cat Allies and our supporters in Lewis County, Washington, I am writing in support of your prosecution of Juan Lopez Abrego. Lopez Abrego is accused of kicking a kitten multiple times, leaving the kitten to suffer. Eventually, Lopez Abrego slammed a tire on top of the kitten, killing her.

Alley Cat Allies is the leading advocacy organization with a mission to protect and improve the lives of all cats and kittens. Since our founding in 1990, we have worked in communities large and small to develop humane, evidence-based policies for cats. We take strong expert action, including in court, against incidents of cruelty to cats.

We offer our support and assistance to ensure this case concludes in a manner that brings justice to the victims and sets a standard for future investigation and prosecution of animal cruelty.

Far too often, our judicial system does not adequately recognize the implications of cruelty to animals and, as a result, does not work to ensure the abusers receive a punishment that reflects the severity of the crime. To underestimate the depravity of animal cruelty and the harm it causes is to fail to recognize cats as sentient beings with inherent value who suffer and feel pain, and deserve neither. It is also a grave failure to grasp the role of cruelty to cats in the greater landscape of violence in our society.

As you may know, the link between animal cruelty and child abuse, domestic violence, and adverse mental health and community health outcomes is well established, and research has found that violence against animals is predictive of, and often co-occurring with, violence against humans. To protect us all, animals and people, it is critical to enforce our animal cruelty laws.

We appreciate your efforts to pursue animal cruelty charges in this case and to seek appropriate punishment. Lopez Abrego reportedly suffers from mental health issues and was recently deemed incompetent. Given that mental health is alleged to be a component of the crime committed in this case, it is essential that the State pursue this matter and that any probationary term requires the offender to complete a mental health evaluation and treatment recommended as a result.

Alley Cat Allies can provide legal assistance at no cost for this case. Our team includes experts in animal cruelty prosecutions who can research legal issues, provide information regarding veterinarians and other expert witnesses, assist with pleadings, submit amicus curiae briefs in support of the prosecution, and even sit second chair to assist with trial.
